My role would be to support policy, employees and community members that use data and opportunity to include the arts in our schools. Not as extra activities but as core subjects that help build depth and breadth of knowledge

Q5 How do you see the arts playing a role in student success in your district? Extensive research (4) has shown that arts education increases student engagement. It helps close opportunity gaps, reduces dropout rates, helps more students be college-ready, and develops the creativity needed in the 21st-century workforce.
